Those using one of the following procedures for inactivation of FMDV are not within the scope of prohibition;

## <sup>(1)</sup> - Milk and cream intended for human consumption;

- a. Those applied a minimum temperature of 132°C for at least one second (ultra high temperature: [UHT]) or
- b. A minimum temperature of 72°C for at least 15 seconds with a pH greater than at least 7.0 (high temperature short-term pasteurization [HTST]), or
- c. Those with a pH of 7.0 or greater and HTST treated twice.

- Milk for animal consumption;

- a. HTST process applied twice; or
- b. HTST, additional heating to at least 72°C in combination with drying or maintaining pH 6 for at least one hour by another physical treatment or
- c. UHT, combined with another physical process specified in (b) above.

### <sup>(2)</sup> - Meat and Meat Products

- a. Canned: Closed canned meats that have been heat-treated for a minimum of 30 minutes until the core temperature reaches at least 70 <sup>0</sup>C in very well-sealed cans
- b. Comprehensive cooking: Meats that have been pre-cleaned of bone and fat, heated until the core temperature reaches at least 70 <sup>0</sup>C or more and cooked for a minimum of 30 minutes at this temperature, packaged against virus contamination and the necessary precautions are taken for or
- c. Drying after salting: Meats defined as a water activity (Aw) with a water-to-protein ratio of not more than 2.25/1 or greater than 0.85, deboned, salted with table salt (Nacl) and completely dried after completion of rigor mortis

### <sup>(3)</sup> - Skin and hides;

- a. Those treated with salt (NaCl) containing 2% sodium carbonate (Na 2 CO 3 ) for at least 28 days or;
- b. Semi-processed hides and skin (calcified skin, pickled skin, wet blue and crust skin)

### <sup>(4)</sup>- Wool and Hair;

- a. Industrial washing consisting of immersing the wool in a series of baths of water, soap and sodium hydroxide (soda) or potassium hydroxide (potash) or
- b. Chemical hair removal by means of slaked lime or sodium sulfide;
- c. Fumigation with formaldehyde in an hermetically sealed chamber for at least 24 hours;
- d. Industrial washing consisting of dipping the wool in a water-soluble detergent kept at 60-70°C;
- e. Wool stored at 4°C for four months, at 18°C for four weeks, or at 37°C for eight days

#### <sup>(5)</sup> - Intestinal Cover:

Treatment with dry salt (NaCl) or saturated brine (NaCl, aw< 0.80) or phosphate-added salt containing 86.5% NaCl, 10.7% Na2HP04 and 2.8% Na3PO4 (w/w/w) for at least 30 days, those kept as dry or saturated brine (aw< 0.80) and at a temperature higher than 12°C all this time.

#### (<sup>6</sup>) - Setal;

- a. Boiled for at least one hour, or;
- b. Immersed in 1% aqueous formaldehyde solution for at least 24 hours.

#### <sup>(7)</sup>- Stem and straw

Stem and straw must not be contaminated with substances of animal origin of identifiable size and, in the case of material sent in bales, have been subjected to one of the following processes, indicating that it has penetrated the center of the bale:

- a. A steam treatment in a closed room such that the central temperature of the bale reaches a minimum temperature of 80°C for at least 10 minutes, or;
- b. A formalin fume (gas formaldehyde) process produced from 35-40% commercial solution for at least 8 hours at a minimum temperature of 19°C.

### <sup>(8)</sup>- Blood, Meat, Bone, Horn and Nail Meal:

Those heat-treated for a minimum of 30 minutes until the core temperature reaches at least 70  $^{0}$ C

# <sup>(9)</sup>- Skins and Trophies of Wild Animals Susceptible to Disease:

Before completing the taxidermy procedure, one of the following procedures should be used:

- a. Boiling in water for a suitable period of time to allow the removal of any substance other than bone, horn, hooves, claws or teeth; or
- b. gamma radiation at a dose of at least 20 kilograms at room temperature (20°C or higher); or
- c. Soak in a 4% (w/v) sodium carbonate (Na<sub>2</sub>CO<sub>3</sub>) solution maintained at pH 11.5 or above for at least 48 hours, with shaking or
- d. Soaking by shaking in a solution of formic acid (100 kg of salt [NaCl] and 12 kg of formic acid per 1000 liters of water) maintained at pH below 3.0 for at least 48 hours; or
- e. In the case of raw hides, those treated with salt (NaCl) containing 2% sodium carbonate (Na2CO3) for at least 28 days.

**NOTE:** Animal products marked with  $(^1)$ ,  $(^2)$ ,  $(^3)$ ,  $(^4)$ ,  $(^5)$ ,  $(^6)$ ,  $(^7)$ ,  $(^8)$ ,  $(^9)$  within the scope of the prohibition can be imported provided that they are subjected to one or more of the treatments specified in  $(^1)$ ,  $(^2)$ ,  $(^3)$ ,  $(^4)$ ,  $(^5)$ ,  $(^6)$ ,  $(^7)$ ,  $(^8)$  and  $(^{9)}$  (treatment will be clearly stated) and that it must be stated in the Health Certificates to be issued by the Veterinary Services of the exporting country that all necessary precautions have been taken against the contamination of these products by the foot-and-mouth disease virus after the procedure.
