 - (iv) Species susceptible to the relevant diseases are not vaccinated against the relevant diseases.

- III.2.3 Requirements for species susceptible to with Spring viremia of carp (SVC), Bacterial Kidney disease (BKD), infection with Infectious pancreatic necrosis virus (IPN), infection with Gyrodactylus salaris (GS), infection with Salmonid alphavirus (SAV) and ⁽³⁾species susceptible to Koi herpes virus disease (KHV)

III.2.4 Transport and labeling requirements:

- III.2.4.1 The aquaculture animals referred to above are placed under conditions, including the water quality, that do not alter their health status.
- III.2.4.2 the transport container or well boat prior to loading is clean and disinfected or previously unused.
- the consignment is identified by a legible label on the exterior of the container, or when transported by well boat, in the ship's manifest, with the relevant information referred to in Part I of this certificate, and the following statement: "(4)[Fish] (4)[Crustaceans] (4)[Molluscs] intended for human consumption in Israel".

- To clarify:
 - This document is valid only when issued and signed by the official competent authority of the exporting country.
 - This document is addressed to the Israeli Ministry of Health and when presented, during the consignment inspection process and thereafter, this document will be considered as the property of the Ministry of Health.

Box reference I.5:Place of origin: name and address of the **dispatch establishment**.

Box reference I.13:Identification of container: Where there is a serial number of the seal it has to be indicated.

Box reference I.12:Date of departure: Will be no sooner than the date of issuing the Health certificate.

Part II:

Box; Identification of commodities:

- Description of commodity: Specify the **appearance** and **main Characteristics** of commodity (ex: head on / head off / fillet / smoked / dried / salted/coated etc., as indicated on the invoice).
- Nature of commodity: Specify whether aquaculture or wild origin
- Treatment type: Specify whether live, chilled, frozen or processed.
- Manufacturing plant: includes factory vessel, freezer vessel, cold store, processing plant.
- Harvesting date: Specify the **original date of harvesting**: specific date in chilled fish and at least, month and year in the case of non-chilled fish.
- Production date: Specify the **original date of** production (freezing , packaging, processing). .
- Best before: Specify the date which is printed on the Hebrew label (optional).
- Shipment No.: Specify the shipment number which is printed on the Hebrew labels.

Part III:

- (1) Part III.1 of this certificate does not apply to countries with special public health certification requirements laid down in equivalence agreements or other European Union legislation.
- (2) Part III.2 of this certificate does not apply to:
 - (a) non-viable crustaceans, which means crustaceans no longer able to survive as living animals if returned to the environment from which they were obtained
 - **(b)** fish which are slaughtered and eviscerated before dispatch
 - (c) aquaculture animals and products thereof, which are placed on the market for human consumption without further processing, provided that they are packed in retail-sale packages which comply with the provisions for such packages in Regulation (EC) No 853/2004,
 - (d) crustaceans destined for processing establishments authorised in accordance with Annex to commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 1882/2018, or for dispatch centers, purification centers or similar businesses which are equipped with an effluent treatment system inactivating the pathogens in question, or where the effluent is subject to other types of treatment reducing the risk of transmitting diseases to the natural waters to an acceptable level,
