

African swine fever, classical swine fever and foot-and-mouth disease in swine



Clinical signs:

- lack of appetite
- dullness, depression
- fever
- reddening of eyes and eye discharge
- enlarged lymph nodes
- respiratory symptoms
- sudden increase in piglet mortality
- sudden deaths without previous signs
- lameness, hindleg stiffness, ataxia, tremors or convulsions
- redness or cyanosis of the skin of the ears, abdomen and legs
- haematomas, bruises
- lesions/blisters on the snout and tongue, between the toes and above the hooves
- abortions, stillbirths/mummies
